Genesee Community College will host a Food Processing Info Day from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on July 17 at the college's seven campus locations for prospective students interested in careers in the food industry. The program helps prepare students for a variety of positions, including quality control technician, packaging specialist, utilities operator, lab clerk, operations manager and regulatory or food control supervisor.
